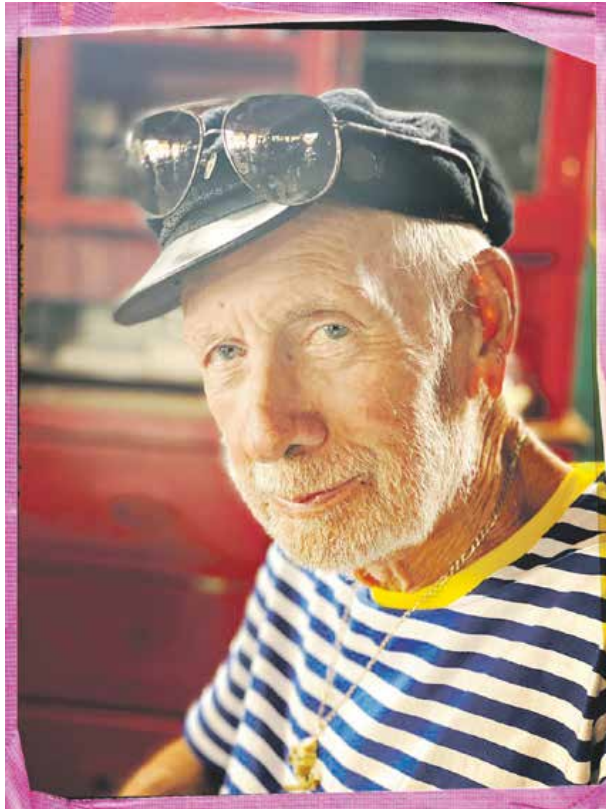
Good wind Marcel!

Marcel... difficult to find the words today. Difficult to take up the pen to tell the departure of a man that so many Saint-Martin residents knew, crossed paths with, loved, or simply caught a glimpse of during an evening in Grand Case. With you, it's much more than a familiar face that disappears. It's an entire era that gently fades away.

Marcel Giudice, «Ti Truc» before becoming known to all as «Marcel the Pirate,» was one of those characters I believed to be eternal. One of those who traverse the years without ever losing their shine or their freedom. Cyclist, restaurateur, adventurer, storyteller, and unapologetic bon vivant, you embodied a certain idea of Saint Martin: free, festive, sometimes excessive, but profoundly alive.

Marcel was that Saint Martin that those under twenty cannot know. A time when the island vibrated with positive energy, when the nights seemed endless, when we were unconcerned with the gaze of others or conventions, and when we gathered at the Pirate's Den. A tavern of privateers, a refuge for bon vivants, a piece of imagination set against the Caribbean Sea, where we too became a bit like pirates. We would embark for an evening without really knowing what time we would return to port. Among the wooden panels of a galleon, the improbable treasures hanging on the walls, the famous restrooms decorated with women's lingerie, and that unique atmosphere where laughter, rum, and good food mixed, you managed to create a place that reflected your image, warm with just the right dose of madness. It was also the pirate boat outings, the endless nights, the anecdotes told with that blend of truth and legend that you had the secret to, the encounters, the excesses, and the stories that one listens to until the end, even when one no longer knows where reality begins.

Of Mediterranean origin, Marcel had traveled the world before dropping anchor in Saint Martin. He found an island that matched his temperament. He belonged to that generation for whom life should be lived intensely, without restraint, and without



ever looking too much behind. Irma sounded the death knell for that era, but despite everything, he managed to keep his spirit of a buccaneer of the seas, recounted in an autobiographical book,

Marcel the Blessed. Eighty pages for eighty years of an incredibly full life. His travels, his loves, his whims, his adventures...

Marcel was the embodiment of good humor. A way of enjoying every moment without ever checking the time. A way of laughing loudly, speaking truthfully, and always resurfacing when life tried to drag him down. An old buccaneer of modern times who moved forward against all odds, driven by his energy and his irrefragable desire to live.

His departure today leaves a particular void. The kind left by popular figures, colorful characters, those who were part of the scenery as much as the soul of the island. Many will feel that with him, a piece of old Saint Martin sets sail one last time.

At 88 years old, you cast off the lines for your final journey. May the trade winds be favorable to you and may your last anchorage be filled with light, rum, and eternal stories to tell. Farewell, Pirate.

National Access to Law Day: Drug Trafficking in Court

As part of the 9th edition of National Access to Law Day (JNAD), the France Victimes association is organizing a conference dedicated to the theme of drug trafficking, on Friday, May 22, from 2 PM to 6 PM, at the local court of Saint-Martin.

Around the world, drug networks are now corroding societies, exacerbating violence, fostering corruption, and generating increasingly organized crime. The island territories of the Caribbean, located on strategic routes of international trafficking, are also facing these issues. On May 9, the

Suspended prison sentence for drug trafficking at the SXM Festival

The Saint Martin court sentenced a man to 18 months in prison with a suspended sentence on May 15, 2026, for offenses related to drug trafficking during the SXM Festival. The offense dates back to March 14, 2024, at the Boho Beach establishment in Sandy Ground.

On March 14, 2024, the gendarmerie was alerted by the organizer of the SXM Festival regarding suspicions of drug trafficking at the venue. Filmed in the restroom by a security agent, the man was found with a festival-goer and was preparing a bag of pink powder, identified as 2C-B. Upon the accused, the military found two bags of cocaine, 25 ecstasy pills, 7.74 grams of MDMA, a bag of cannabis weighing 0.59 grams, as well as \$561 and €90 in cash. Tests revealed he was positive for cocaine, methamphetamine, and amphetamines.

During the hearing, the man denied selling illegal drugs while acknowledging that he was a consumer of various drugs. However, several testimonies, along with a video, implicated him. The court found him guilty of all the charges against him: illegal use, transport, possession, acquisition, offer, or unauthorized transfer of narcotics. Although he had been troubled in 2022 for similar offenses, he was acquitted due to a procedural issue, and his criminal record was then clean. Last Friday, the court in Saint-Martin sentenced him to 18 months of criminal imprisonment, fully suspended with a probation period of 24 months. In this context, the accused must: comply with a treatment obligation, a work obligation, and pay the amounts owed to the public treasury. The court also prohibited him from appearing in establishments hosting the SXM Festival, as well as on Saint-James Street in Marigot and Sandy Ground Street. **L.G**

Assault by three women at Eastern Bay

On the night of May 18 to 19, 2024, three women were assaulted in Orient Bay. Arrested, two of the alleged attackers will appear on June 12, 2026, before the local court of Saint Martin.

The defendants are being prosecuted for sexual assault committed in a group and aggravated violence resulting in an incapacity of more than eight days. The case was initially scheduled to be examined on May 15. It has ultimately been postponed to June 12, 2026, to allow for the consolidation of the files concerning the two identified assailants. One of the accused is already detained in Baie-Mahault as part of another proceeding for acts of rape committed under the threat of a weapon. He remains in provisional detention in the Baie Orientale case to ensure his presence at the hearing and to prevent any risk of reoffending. As for the second defendant, he is currently recovering following a gunshot wound. **L.G**

National Navy once again intercepted a vessel in the maritime zone of the Antilles and seized 104 bales of cocaine, totaling 3,336 kg of drugs. This conference, open to the public within the limits of available seating, will address drug trafficking through the testimony of Christine Saunier-Ruellan, an honorary magistrate known for being the investigating judge in the case known as «Air Cocaine.»

One of the most significant international drug trafficking cases involving France in recent years had surprising twists and received extensive media coverage; so much so that Netflix decided to make a documentary titled «Is There a Dealer on the Plane?» Christine Saunier-Ruellan will come to share her experience as a magistrate confronted with the challenges of international drug trafficking and the judicial mechanisms implemented in such complex cases. Through this meeting, the public will be able to discuss the issues related to drug trafficking, its impact on terri-



tories, and the work carried out by the justice system in the face of these criminal networks. **A.B**

“Understand Before Judging” : a day of awareness against LGBTQIA+phobias

Three groups of about fifteen people participated on Sunday in the dance workshops offered by the SAFE association, the only active LGBTQIA+ association in Saint Martin and Saint Barthélemy. This initiative was organized on the occasion of IDAHOT, the International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia, and Biphobia, to raise public awareness about discrimination related to gender or sexual orientation.

On the occasion of this international day - (LGBTQIA: Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or questioning, Intersex, Asexual, Aromantic, or Non-binary) - the association SAFE focused on body expression, creativity, and dialogue. Three dance workshops, led by professional dancers and choreographers, were offered at the Grand Case Beach Club, followed by a roundtable discussion on issues of diversity, inclusion, and the fight against discrimination.

MORE DIFFICULT IN THE CARIBBEAN?

The association currently has about fifty members. A modest number that also illustrates the difficulty in accurately assessing the number of people affected in the territory, as issues related to sexual orientation or gender identity remain taboo in some families and social circles. Through its network of members, SAFE offers supportive housing to individuals who find themselves in difficulty, sometimes even within their own families. An agreement has notably been signed with the association FLAG. The latter primarily brings together police officers, gendarmes, public agents, and security personnel engaged in the fight against discrimination related to sexual orientation or gender identity. It mobilizes in supporting victims, raising awareness among law enforcement, and training on discrimination issues. Every year in Saint-Martin, SAFE assists at least two people facing emergency situations. Other questions arise, such as the support for transgender indi-

viduals, which is non-existent in the territory. To begin a transition process, most must travel to mainland France for two years to benefit from a transition pathway with complete coverage of care if done in the public sector.

ADVANCING LGBTI EQUALITY IN EUROPE

Initiatives around the world are numerous, but political mobilization is necessary to make progress. Hosted by Denmark in cooperation with the Nordic Council of Ministers and co-organized with the Council of Europe, the 2026 edition of the European IDAHOT+ Forum will focus on the theme «Advancing LGBTI Equality: Meeting Challenges and Shaping the Future in Europe.» It will be followed on May 20 and 21 by the meeting in Copenhagen of the Council of Europe’s Expert Committee on Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression, and Sex Characteristics. This committee will continue its intergovernmental work, including finalizing the draft Strategy of the Council of Europe for the rights of LGBTI people (2027–2032), and will contribute to developing a more structured and forward-looking approach to equality. Founded in Sint Maarten before establishing itself in Saint-Martin, the association SAFE has also been active in Saint-Barthélemy for nearly 18 months. While it does not yet have a local presence on the Northern Islands, it organizes year-round itinerant awareness actions and exchange times aimed at fostering dialogue and connection.



It will again be mobilized on October 11 for «Coming Out Day,» and, as last year, on November 22 for the international day for the elimination of gender-based and sexual violence in partnership with the association Nous Toutes. Throughout the year, it also offers debate aperitifs and develops a component dedicated to «civic awakening,» aiming to promote mutual understanding and coexistence.

Disappearance of a Hiker in Saba: the STIS 978 Deployed for Support

At the request of the governor of Saba, two canine teams from STIS 978 in Saint Martin were sent Saturday morning to participate in the search for Erik Matthijsen, a 53-year-old Dutchman who has been missing since May 13.



Passionate about hiking, Erik Matthijsen was last seen last Wednesday around 11 AM as he set out to walk in the Well's Bay area, located in the northwest of the island. After two days of unsuccessful searches, the authorities of Saba called in the Saint Martin search and rescue dog handlers who landed on the island Saturday morning to immediately take part in the search operations, which also mobilized helicopters, drones, and thermal cameras used during nighttime searches. The authorities also attempted to locate the missing person's mobile phone. On Sunday evening, during the crisis meeting, the search teams indicated that due to the time

elapsed, the chances of finding him alive were unlikely. However, the search resumed Monday morning with the arrival of a new team from USAR (specializing in search and rescue, mobilized during natural disasters or missing persons worldwide) consisting of eleven people and nine dogs. Erik Matthijsen was also a member of USAR.NL and was on the island as part of the Mount Scenery Tower project.

This mobilization illustrates the quality of operational cooperation and mutual assistance between France and the Netherlands in managing emergency situations in the Caribbean.

These professions require going to sea, aboard surface ships, submarines, and marine commandos... but with varying frequency depending on the profession. Promotions can be rapid as they occur every two to three years.

The France Travail event will showcase all recruitment and training opportunities in maritime professions, in collaboration with the Army, the Air and Space Force, the maritime customs, as well as the Local Mission, the Collectivity of Saint-Martin, the CCISM, and SXM Santé Travail.

The weekend results

Thibault Poret, street photographer

Whether on the rooftops of Montreal or wandering the streets of Saint-Martin, Thibault Poret has developed a passion for street photography. Initially fascinated by dizzying shots, he has refined his style and now captures scenes of everyday life.



Originally from Saint-Martin and more specifically from Oyster Pond, Thibault Poret currently resides in Montreal. A destination where he settled in 2016 for studies in hotel management. Ten years later and still in Canada, for him the objective has shifted focus. During his studies in Quebec, Thibault discovers photography, symmetry, but also the thrill of shots taken from the tops of buildings. "At first, I took photos with my phone and then with a Nikon camera. I climbed on rooftops and cranes. This defined my style for 2-3 years." Images that catch the eye and sometimes even that of the authorities. Stopped by the Canadian police, the Saint-Martinois escapes without charges but makes a change in perspective in his practice.

Back to earth, then. Thibault swaps the heights for the pavement and fully dedicates himself to street photography. With this new approach comes an entirely new style. For him, gone are the burst shots: "I capture funny moments, I learn to observe and

take photos as if I had film equipment." In this gradual adjustment, his gear also changes. Out with the multiple cameras and lenses, in with a single body, a Fujifilm X100V, with a fixed 35 mm lens. "I realized that many of my photos stayed on my SD card and that I didn't like spending time retouching them on my computer. This camera is simplistic with presets that allow me not to modify my photos. I fell in love with the aesthetics of Fujifilm and black and white," explains the amateur photographer.

In Montreal, he develops documentary photography. In 2023, he finds himself at the center of the news when a historic site, the chapel of Bon-Pasteur, catches fire right across from his home. He captures this event, and his images are purchased by the city archives, his timelapses broadcast by Quebec media. A recognition that remains, for him, outside the framework of a predetermined career. "I never aimed to make photography my profession," he explains. Preferring to vary his shots, he is now preparing to become a rope access technician, a job at height that is reminiscent of his early shots. Always very attached to Saint-Martin, he hopes to one day join the Fuji X Photographer program and, why not, become a brand ambassador in the Caribbean.
